



On Sunday, April 11 at 2 PM, our speaker **David Hirsh** will be talking about the antisemitism of the left and its entanglement with anti Zionism.

We are doing a Sunday afternoon program because David will be joining us from the UK where it is 5 hours later.

Here is some information about him:

David Hirsh (born 29 September 1967) is a lecturer in Sociology at <u>Goldsmiths</u>, <u>University of London</u>, and co-founder of <u>Engage</u>, a campaign against the <u>academic</u> boycott of Israel.[1]

Hirsh won the <u>British Sociological Association</u> <u>Philip Abrams Memorial Prize</u> for the best first book in sociology for 2004, for his book *Law Against Genocide: Cosmopolitan trials.*[5] The book, on the significance of "cosmopolitan law", contains an account of the 1999 British trial of <u>Anthony Sawoniuk</u> for <u>Holocaust</u>-related crimes committed in Belarus in 1942.

In 2005, he co-founded the Engage website, a resource for those working to oppose the boycott of Israel. [4] Hirsh took a leading role during 2005-07 in opposing boycotts of Israeli universities proposed by British academics. [6][7] Hirsh told The Guardian, "It may not have anti-semitic motivations, but if you organise an academic boycott of Israeli Jewish academics but no-one else in the world, that is an anti-semitic policy". [8] His 2017 book, Contemporary Left Antisemitism, which combined narrative and case study with sociological analysis and theory to understand the controversial and contested phenomenon of antisemitism on the left, was published in 2017. [3]

We will hear from David and discuss the risks of similar problems here in Canada.
