



KBI has been a supporter and member of the Multifaith Housing Initiative (MHI) since the shul's earliest days. Providing safe, secure and permanent affordable housing for individuals and families who are without a home or at risk of homelessness is at the core of what MHI does. This work embodies in a very practical way what Torah teaches us and what we recently learned about the Jubilee year.

MHI's tenants need you now more than ever. The pandemic is making it hard for many residents to make ends meet. But covid-19 won't stop MHI's annual fundraiser, Tulipathon 2021, scheduled for this Sunday, May 30, in support of MHI's rental subsidy program for tenants in greatest need.

MHI currently provides housing and a sense of home to more than 400 individuals. That number is growing since Veterans House was completed at the beginning of March. New tenants have been moving in slowly (covid makes nothing easy) and they are starting to make a home for themselves on the site of the former Rockliffe Air Force Base.

As one of the new residents at Veterans House recently said, "It feels good saying 'I've got a home again'. In fact it feels so good I'm going to say it a second time!"
